Church Street

The Lichfield Vaults is haunted by a mischievous spirit that moves barrels and hides objects, even making beer mats fly in the air. It is probably more of a ghost than an actual spirit; some people find its antics likeable while others are freaked out by it.

County Hospital

This site was until the 1930s, the city slaughterhouse, which stood where the front entrance and car park are now. Muffled voices have been heard at this spot but, on investigation, no one has been there. Dore, Kenwater, and Lugg wards seem to have a particular reputation, with some staff refusing to go past them alone at nights. Patients seem to be mostly unaffected but staff, resting during the night shift, have found blankets ripped off them as they lay in bed. In the building of the new hospital, four workmen were killed in an accident at the spot where Lugg ward now stands.

Daws Road

Belle Vue Terrace, on this road, has a fearsome reputation among some previous tenants. They report a feeling of oppression haunting the house, and items vanishing only to re-appear in unusual places. Worryingly, the front door has, on several occasions, been found wide open in the morning, although securely locked the night before. Several people have reported waking in the early hours of the morning to the sound of children running up and down the stairs, although there were no children in the house.

Eign Street

The Horse And Groom pub has a very lively ghost who delights in patting ladies' bottoms. A heavy object has also been heard being dragged across a room upstairs. Have you seen the lovely big paintings appearing all over Hereford? Art works have been painted on the ends of prominent buildings and in underpasses and passageways across the city. Some have been done by important international artists and others by talented Herefordshire artists.

There is also going to be a new sculpture trail in Hereford City Centre which residents and visitors will be able



to discover from spring 2024. Old shop signage brackets will be reused to display newly crafted pieces made by students from Hereford College of Arts as well as well known established artists.

The history of the Weir Garden dates to Roman times, however the garden visitors see today is Predominantly a 1920s vision, inspired and created by Roger Parr.

Parr was responsible for many of the features in

the garden including the retaining wall, the rustic hut and boathouse, which is a rare survival from this era.

The riverside garden is left natural with many wildflowers in summer, snowdrops in the winter and daffodils in spring. At the bottom of the garden there's a small woodland to explore and for those who love wildlife seventy species of bird have been spotted here as well as the odd otter sighting on a sunny day. It's not uncommon to see a ballet of swans passing through as well as one or two canoeists enjoying one of the most beautiful rivers in the UK, the Wye.

Visitors are always welcome to bring along a picnic whilst they sit and enjoy the stunning views. The bird hide provides a quiet space to sit and watch garden birds on feeders and just across the car park is the walled garden which once would have served a purpose supplying the mansion with fruit and vegetables.

The three-sided walled garden takes in more impressive views of the estate and houses an impressive seventy-foot glasshouse with grapes, figs, tomatoes and succulents growing inside.

Leominster By the Sea will be the do not miss event of the summer season, coming your way 8th-15th June.


About Face will be performing at this, there might be some brides wandering round from the performance company!

Eastnor Castle — By L. Perkins

Eastnor Castle is a beautiful Georgian Castle near Ledbury, Herefordshire and is surrounded by a beautiful deer park and lake. The castle is still the home of the Hervey-Bathurst family and contains medieval armour and fine art and designed by A.W.Pugin.

In the grounds there is plenty to do for all ages including an adventure playground, junior obstacle course, knight's maze, treetop walkway, woodland play area, lakeside and woodland walks. The arboretum contains the finest collection of Cedars in Britain and has tree trails and rope swings.

There is a cafe and a large picnic area with tables on the Valley Lawn and is dog friendly.





Eastnor Castle has a Steam & Vintage event, May 28-29 with lots of steam engines and vintage cars. The cost for adults is £14, children £8, family ticket (up to 3 children) £40.

We visited some years ago and we really enjoyed it.
